Themes from Committee Discussions

- The issues identified by this subcommittee are important to solving institutionalized barriers to equity, inclusion, and justice
- Root causes need to be examined and changed
- Changes need to be guided at the highest levels of leadership



Recommendations in Three Categories:

- Planning tools for envisioning and completing a degree
- Reduce administrative and academic barriers to create seamless navigation of policies and processes for students, faculty and staff
- Access and ability to move into and within the university



Key Performance Indicators

<u>Degree planning tools</u>: Improvement in degree planning tools will increase the percentage of 4-year graduation rates and reduce associated student loan debt for educational costs

Reducing barriers created by administrative and academic policies and procedures: Reducing these associated barriers will increase the percentage of 4-year graduation rates, decrease student education loan debt, create administrative and staff salary savings

Access and ability to move into and within the university: Flexibility of movement within the Penn State system will reduce student time to degree and associated education loan debt, while maximizing the student educational experience with ease of course choice

Planning tools for envisioning and completing a degree

1.2.1. Create the ability for a student and their adviser to correctly and reliably identify all degree requirements which includes individual department lists; how transfer courses will count; and the applicable program year



Reduce administrative and academic barriers to create seamless navigation of policies and processes for students, faculty and staff

- 1.2.2. Review, identify and eliminate barriers in administrative policies and business processes
- 1.2.3. Review, identify and eliminate barriers in academic policies and business processes
- 1.2.4. Create a broader access to academic advising that is transferrable across all Penn State locations
- 1.2.5. Allow a Penn State course to be treated as the same course in every Penn State degree regardless of the course location



Access and ability to move into and within the university

- 1.2.6. Create a seamless process to allow students to stop out as needed from the University and allow them the opportunity to re-start without administrative barriers
- 1.2.7. Employ consistent system wide planning and evaluation to determine number of course offerings each semester/year based on student projected enrollments
- 1.2.8. Create a tuition revenue plan and accompanying budget model to support student enrollment growth as well as fund University initiatives in an equitable and non-competitive approach
